

## PE and Sports Premium 2015 - 2016

This academic year, Bredgar CEP School has received £8,520 from the Government in PE and Sports Premium funding. This funding is ring-fenced and must be used to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport offered. The premium should develop or add to the PE and sport activities that Bredgar CEP School already offers and make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years.

The rate of use dropped off fairly quickly at school. When asked if still using them at home, 25% of children said that they were still using them sometimes, 5% regularly and the rest had not used them very much since they got them.

Monitoring of PE teaching has been judged to be good or better across the school.
	Safe Practice in Physical Education and Sport Membership	£40.58	Provision for health and safety has improved through consultation with the literature produced by this organisation. No significant accidents this academic year.
