

PE and Sports Premium 2016 - 2017

This academic year, Bredgar CEP School will receive £8,454 from the Government in PE and Sports Premium funding. This funding is ring-fenced and must be used to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport offered. The premium should develop or add to the PE and sport activities that Bredgar CEP School already offers and make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years.
